[Your organization] supports the proposed Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing Assessment Tool because it will provide clear guidance to jurisdictions, advocates, and especially to the residents who federal funds are intended to assist.

[Your organization] endorses all efforts to improve the ability of low income people, particularly residents of the protected classes, to move to high opportunity areas.

However, [your organization] is concerned that the proposed Assessment Tool has no features that take into account the choice of long-time low income residents, and especially residents who are members of protected classes, to remain in their publicly supported affordable housing and/or in the communities where they have social networks.

As proposed, we fear that the Assessment Tool could be misinterpreted to prevent community revitalization efforts by well-established community-based development organizations. We also fear that the Assessment Tool could be misinterpreted to prevent efforts to preserve federally assisted housing that many long-time residents call home and want to continue to call home.

We urge HUD to add provisions in the final Assessment Tool that recognize community-based revitalization efforts as community assets, and that will respect the choice of residents to preserve their publicly supported homes and to remain in their communities.
