THE 2012 NLIHC HOUSING POLICY CONFERENCE

We hope you will join us at our 2012 Housing Policy Conference and Lobby Day March 25-28 in Washington, D.C. At the conference, you will hear from leading Administration, HUD and Congressional officials on what lies ahead for socially just housing policy. With 40 plenary and workshop sessions, an evening reception and Congressional office visits, you will leave this year's conference prepared to take action.

NLIHC believes this conference is an important event for residents and tenants to attend. We work hard to make it possible and worthwhile. NLIHC members and low income people who pay their own registration fees qualify for discounted registration rates. The conference features many workshops just for residents and tenants.

YOUR NLIHC CONFERENCE EXPERIENCE

When you arrive at the conference on the evening of Sunday, March 25, you will check in and meet fellow advocates from across the country at the Conference Welcome Center. NLIHC staff, board members and state coalition partners will be on hand to greet you.

Monday, March 26 starts with a breakfast session with keynote speaker and Pulitzer Prize-winning **Washington Post columnist Eugene Robinson**. Mr. Robinson will speak with attendees and sign a number of his books after his presentation. Following the first round of workshop sessions, you will enjoy a lunchtime address from **Representative Barney Frank (D-MA)**. After another round of workshops, you will cap off Monday with a hosted evening reception at the Omni Shoreham Hotel.

You will begin Tuesday, March 27 with the annual NLIHC membership meeting and the presentation of three awards. These awards are the State and Local Organizing Award, Resident Organizing Award and the Media Award. It will be an inspiring look at good work being done across the country. Later, **AFL-CIO Executive Vice President Arlene Holt Baker** will speak during the lunch program. She has been a grassroots organizer for more than 30 years.

Lobby Day caps off the conference on Wednesday, March 28. After breakfast at the hotel, you will head to Capitol Hill for meetings with your Members of Congress.

All day on Monday and Tuesday you will attend workshops on a wide range of topics. These topics include Grassroots Strategies for Leveraging Social Action, Resident Organizing and Participation, the Housing Needs of Veterans, and many more.

ATTENDING THE CONFERENCE

The conference will be held at the Omni Shoreham Hotel at 2500 Calvert Street NW in Washington, D.C. The hotel is just one block from the Woodley Park/National Zoo Metro Station on the Red Line. The hotel is close to a wide variety of restaurants and shops, and easy access to downtown Washington, D.C.

The hotel is offering NLIHC a Special Room Rate of \$209 per night (single/double). This special rate expires on Friday, March 2 or when our room block is full, whichever comes first.
