Re: Vote NO on Stop Dangerous Sanctuary Cities Act (S. 3100) – Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program Funding at Risk

We, the undersigned national organizations representing elected officials and a broad sprecum of housing and community development organizations urge you to oppose the Stop Dangerous Sanctuary Cities Act, (S. 3100) introduced by Senator Toomey, when the bill is considered on the Senate floor. This misguided proposal would punish communities that have immigrant "sanctuary" laws and policies in place by stripping them of federal funding provided through the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program.

Since being established in 1974, the CDBG program has strengthened thousands of communities across America, and has assisted hundreds of millions of people with low and moderate incomes. CDBG is a valued program, contributing to local economies, serving households in need, maintaining and stabilizing neighborhoods, and providing the flexibility to develop partnerships and projects that are vital to the well-being of communities nationwide.

While the purported goal of S. 3100 is to make America's communities more secure, the bill does anything but. Instead, S. 3100 will undermine local efforts to improve the safety and quality of life of residents by depriving communities of CDBG funding needed to undertake initiatives to stabilize neighborhoods and provide decent affordable housing for low income households. Our government should not play politics with communities' ability to serve their residents by holding essential CDBG funding hostage.

For these reasons, we ask that you reject S. 3100.
