MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT & CEO

DEAR NLIHC MEMBERS, DONORS, AND FRIENDS:

LIHC had a momentous 2016. After 17 years at the helm of the Coalition and a lifetime of dedication and accomplishment, Sheila Crowley retired as NLIHC president and CEO, and I assumed the mantle. Among her many achievements at NLIHC, Sheila led the effort to create and fund the national Housing Trust Fund (HTF), the first new affordable housing resource in a generation for those with the lowest incomes, and launched and grew the United for Homes Campaign calling for mortgage tax reform and reinvesting the savings into ending homelessness and housing poverty. I am immensely grateful to Sheila for leaving NLIHC so strong and for her guidance to me as I stepped into the role of president and CEO.

NLIHC's staff worked tirelessly in 2016 to ensure a successful first-year rollout of the HTF, providing training, resources and technical assistance to advocates and state agencies throughout the country. We continued to convene and lead important broad-based national advocacy campaigns – the Campaign for Housing and Community Development, the United for Homes campaign, the National HTF Policy Committee, and the Housing and Criminal Justice Reform Task Force – and to support the work of NLIHC's 61 state partners around the country. We met extensively with members of Congress on both sides of the aisle and with the administration throughout the year to support policy solutions to housing poverty and homelessness.

NLIHC received extensive media coverage of our 2016 research publications *Out of Reach, The Gap: Affordable Housing Gap Analysis, and The Long Wait for a Home.* Our expertise was cited in over 2,200 media stories reaching tens of millions of individuals during the year, and we achieved nearly 35,000 Twitter followers and 4,000,000 Twitter impressions.

NLIHC's 2016 Housing Policy Forum featured HUD Secretary Julián Castro, Senator Tim Kaine, former Representative Barney Frank, and an array of other thought-leaders on the challenges and solutions to housing poverty in the U.S. We were pleased to honor Representative Barbara Lee with the Edward Brooke Housing Leadership Award; Nancy Bernstine from the National AIDS Housing Coalition with the Cushing Dolbeare Lifetime Service Award; and the Coalition for Nonprofit Housing and Economic Development of Washington DC with the 2016 Housing Organizer Award.

As 2016 drew to a close, the political landscape in Washington changed dramatically. It was clear was that NLIHC's mission to achieve socially just public policy to ensure the lowest income people have decent affordable homes was never more important. I am honored and proud to continue the critical work of those who came before me in advancing this mission.

All our advancements are due to our strong and dedicated partners and members. Our membership truly is our strength. Together we can end homelessness and housing poverty in America.





As the July 27 Wonkblog excerpt "For private market, the numbers for building rentals for the poor don't add up" vividly pointed out, we face an alarming gap between the housing needs of our nation's poorest families and what is available and affordable to them. Congress has the tools to help meet this needs housing choice vouchers and the National Housing Trust Fund. To end housing insecurity for families with the greatest needs, Congress must increase investments in these programs.

Housing choice vouchers help more than 2.2 million families live in stable, affordable homes by covering the difference between what they can afford to pay and the cost of rent. Despite the program's success, limited funding means very few eligible families receive this needed assistance.

fter 17 years as president and CEO of NLIHC, Sheila Crowley retired in the spring of 2016. LIHC continued to convene and lead several broad-based national policy advocacy campaigns and task forces in 2016. The Campaign for Housing and Community Development (CHCDF) consists of 70 national organizations that advocate collectively for the highest possible federal funding for all affordable housing and community development programs. The United for Homes (UFH) campaign, endorsed by more than 2,300 organizational and elected official endorsers nationwide, calls for modest reforms to the mortgage interest deduction

to benefit 25 million low and moderate income homeowners and to generate \$240 billion in savings over 10 years to invest in affordable rental housing for people with the lowest incomes. The national Housing Trust Fund (HTF) policy committee consists of dozens of national partners who work to protect and expand HTF resources. And the Housing and Criminal Justice Reform task force of more than twenty national housing and civil rights groups advocates for policies that ensure justice-

involved individuals can successfully return to decent, affordable homes after incarceration.



2016 NLIHC STATE PARTNERS

LIHC has partnerships with 61 state housing coalitions in 42 states and the District of Columbia. These state STATE partners are committed to advocating for socially just federal housing policy as well as for such policies in their own states, and they rely on one another and on NLIHC to learn about innovative practices for effective advocacy. These state partners are vital to NLIHC's mission, regularly mobilizing tens of thousands of advocates around federal policy issues. NLIHC staff convenes monthly state partner calls featuring new NLIHC research, federal policy updates, new and ongoing advocacy campaigns, NLIHC media toolkits and support, quest presenters on special topics, and peer learning. NLIHC convenes two in-person state partner meetings in Washington, DC each year for more in-depth learning and sharing. NLIHC's team of housing advocacy organizers regularly provides news, information, and training through webinars and conference calls hosted by state partners with resources tailored to those states. In 2016, NLIHC staff presented as keynote speakers, plenary panelists, and workshop presenters at 20 events hosted by state partners in 17 states, attended by more than 5,600 advocates. NLIHC also engaged state partners through NLIHC-led webinars and calls and participated in numerous advocacy days and other activities organized by our state partners.



A NEW LEADER FOR NLIHC

DIANE YENTEL ASSUMES NLIHC LEADERSHIP AT ANNUAL FORUM

Diane Yentel, former vice president of public policy and government affairs at Enterprise Community Partners, was introduced to affordable housing advocates as the new NLIHC president and CEO at the NLIHC 2016 Housing Policy Forum held in Washington, DC, April 3-5. Prior to her time at Enterprise, Ms. Yentel directed public housing policy development and implementation at HUD and before that served as a senior domestic policy advisor for Oxfam America, a housing policy coordinator for the Massachusetts Coalition for the



Homeless, a policy specialist at NLIHC, and a Peace Corps volunteer in Zambia.

The Policy Forum, attended by over 270 attendees, also featured keynote addresses by HUD Secretary Julián Castro, U.S. Senator Tim Kaine (D-VA), and former U.S. Representative Barney Frank, as well as a wide array of other sessions on the challenges and solutions to housing poverty in the U.S. The attendees visited their congressional delegations on Capitol Hill on the last day of the event.






OUT OF REACH 2016

NO REFUGE FOR LOW INCOME RENTERS

LIHC released its Out of Reach 2016 on May 25 at a press event with then-HUD Secretary Julián Castro, who wrote the preface for the report. This edition of *Out of Reach* showed that the national "housing wage," the hourly wage a full-time worker must earn to afford a modest two-bedroom apartment while spending no more than 30% of household income on rent and utilities, was \$20.30 per hour. In six states and the District of Columbia, the housing wage exceeded \$25 per hour. The average renter in the



U.S. earned just \$15.42 per hour, nearly \$5 per hour less than the national two-bedroom housing wage and nearly \$1 per hour less than the one-bedroom housing wage. Someone earning the federal minimum wage of \$7.25 would need to work 112 hours per week, or 2.8 full-time jobs to afford a two-bedroom rental unit and 90 hours per week, or 2.3 full-time jobs, to afford a one-bedroom unit. The interactive Out of Reach website with maps and graphics allows users to compare metro areas and counties within their state and between states. Out of Reach attracted extensive media coverage in 2016, including by The Wall Street Journal, The Washington Post, Forbes, The Chicago Tribune, Time Magazine, City Lab, Vox, Politico, NPR News, and many others. The CityLab article on the 2016 Out of Reach report was shared more than 75,000 times.



THE GAP REPORT 2016

THE AFFORDABLE HOUSING GAP ANALYSIS

LIHC released the 2016 edition of The Gap: The Affordable Housing Gap Analysis on March 24, documenting a shortage of 7.2 million affordable and available rental units for the nation's 10.4 million extremely low income (ELI) renter households with incomes at or below 30% of their area median. Nationally, there were only 31 affordable and available rental units for every 100 ELI renter households, and 75% of ELI renters were severely cost-burdened, spending more than half of their income on rent and utilities. The Gap details the shortage of affordable and available rental housing at different income thresholds, as well as cost burdens, for every state, DC, and the 50 largest metro areas. The Gap was featured in such outlets as CityLab,

Huffington Post, NPR, Affordable Housing Finance and Mortgage News.



There is a shortage of 7.2 million available rental units for ELI households, or only 31 units for every 100 ELI renter households.



TENANT TALK SPRING & FALL 2016

COVERS ISSUES THAT IMPACT LOW INCOME TENANTS

LIHC produced two editions of Tenant Talk, a magazine for low income residents, in 2016 distributing more than 3,800 copies to residents and resident association members of NLIHC. The spring issue featured fair housing, local organizing victories, a federal budget update, HUD's public housing smoking ban, and a special recognition


of NLIHC Board Member Delorise Calhoun. The fall issue featured a series of articles on voter engagement, registration and mobilization; state and local affordable housing ballot initiatives; a resident action project in the state of Washington; and a resident Empowerment Conference and the new Business and Service Coordination Center in Cincinnati, among other topics.



HOUSING SPOTLIGHT 2016

LIHC's The Long Wait for a Home released in October analyzed the current state of Housing Choice Vouchers (HCV) and public housing waiting lists across the country. The study showed that that 53% of HCV waiting lists were closed to new applicants and 4% were open only to specific populations, such as homeless individuals and families, veterans, or persons with a disability. Sixtyfive percent of closed HCV waiting lists had been closed for at least one year. HCV waiting lists had a median wait time of 1.5 years. Twenty-five percent had a wait of at least 3 years, and 25% of the largest public housing authorities with HCV waiting lists had a wait time of at least 7 years. Wait lists for public housing had a median wait time of 9 months, and 25% had a wait time of at least 1.5 years.




2016 LEADERSHIP AND ORGANIZING AWARD



MATTHEW DESMOND SPEAKS ABOUT EVICTIONS

LIHC partnered with the Coalition on Human Needs and the National Housing Conference to host an event on April 29, 2016 at which Harvard Sociologist and MacArthur Genius Awardee Dr. Matthew Desmond discussed his Pulitzer Prize winning book, Evicted: Poverty and Profit in the American City. More than 160 individuals attended the event in person and another 230 participated by live-stream. Dr. Desmond engaged in a live Twitter chat following the event. The chat trended at the number 8 spot on Twitter.



HOUSING TRUST **FUND**

LIHC was deeply involved in ensuring a successful rollout of the national Housing Trust Fund (HTF) in its first year of implementation. NLIHC conducted numerous national and state-specific HTF implementation trainings and webinars; analyzed and communicated on HUD's HTF guidance; identified and prepared HTF state advocacy "point persons" in every state, Puerto Rico and DC; produced and disseminated model HTF Allocation Plans; developed a new HTF Developers Advisory Group to serve as a resource to advocates and affordable housing developers around the country; and published two papers on financing and operating extremely low income affordable housing and on using operating assistance and operating assistance reserves. All 50 states and DC completed and submitted their HTF Allocation Plans to HUD in 2016, and the first funds began to flow to the states for project implementation.
