NPP's Mission

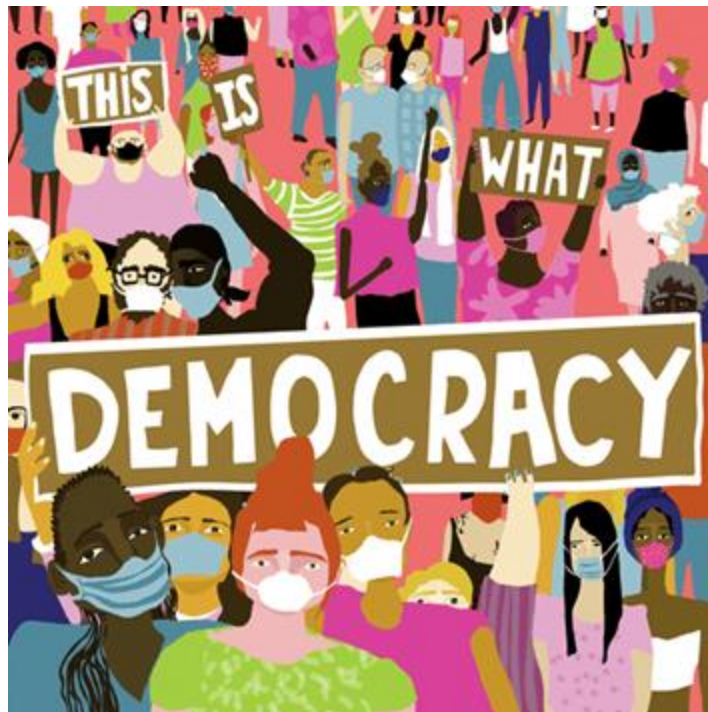

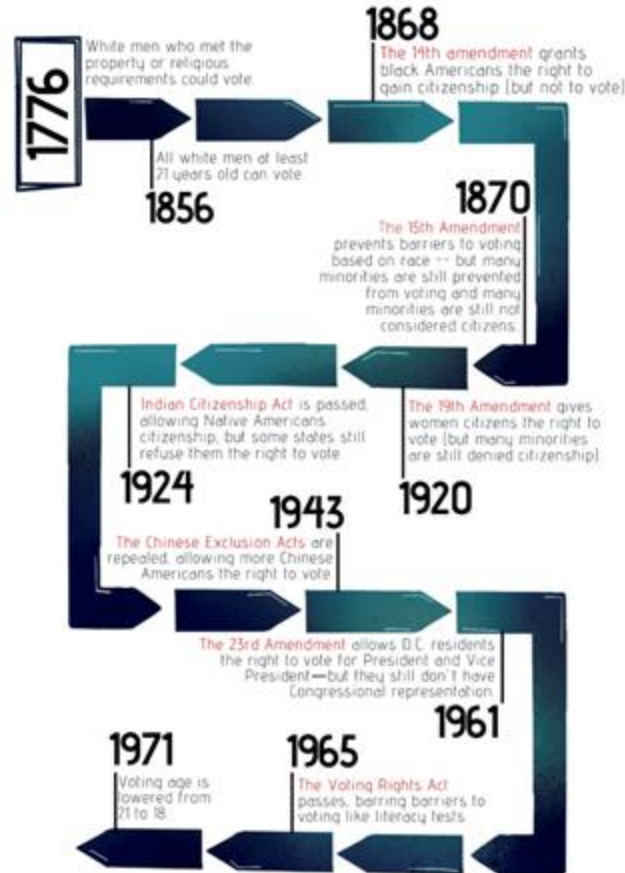

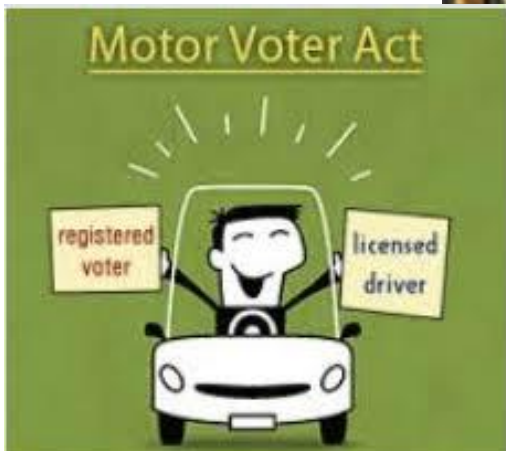

Peninsula Passes Restrictive Voter ID Bill

Peninsula's Senate, in a 26-23 vote, passed a restrictive voter ID bill, one of the first such laws to pass in 2012.

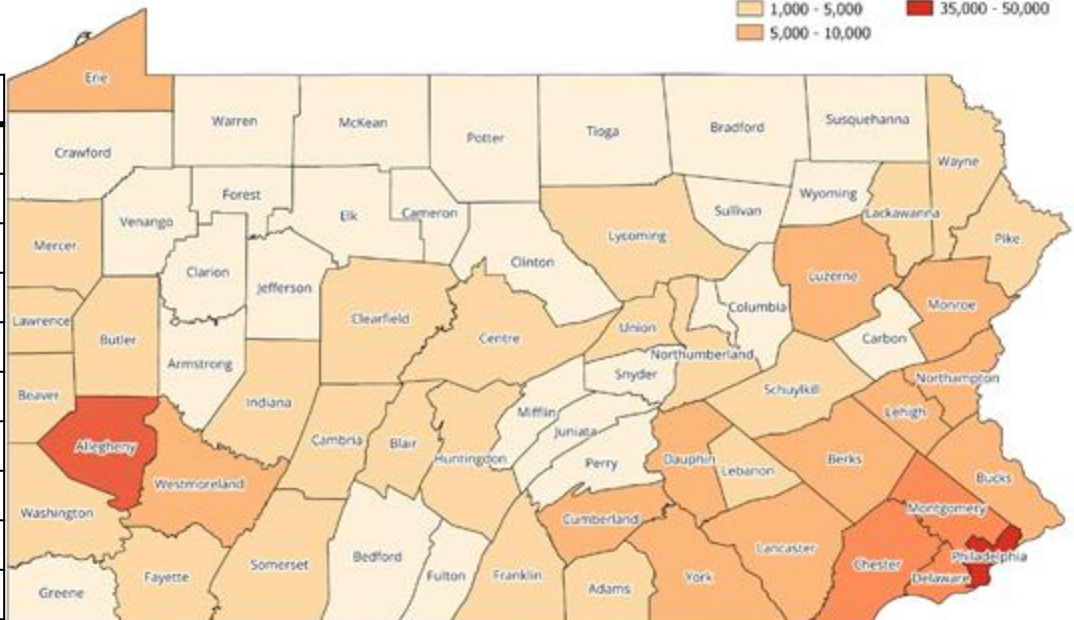

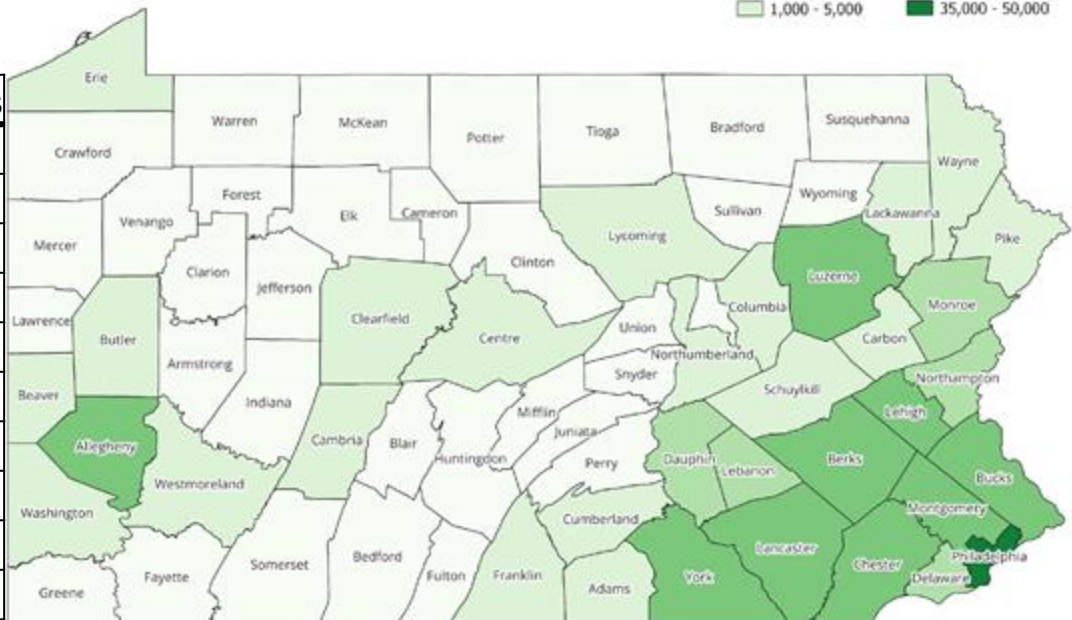

TRUTH

Voter ID laws are 'new versions' of old tactics to suppress votes.

Rules that require ID to vote are part of a broad, well-funded, and deliberate effort to block millions of Americans from the voting booth.

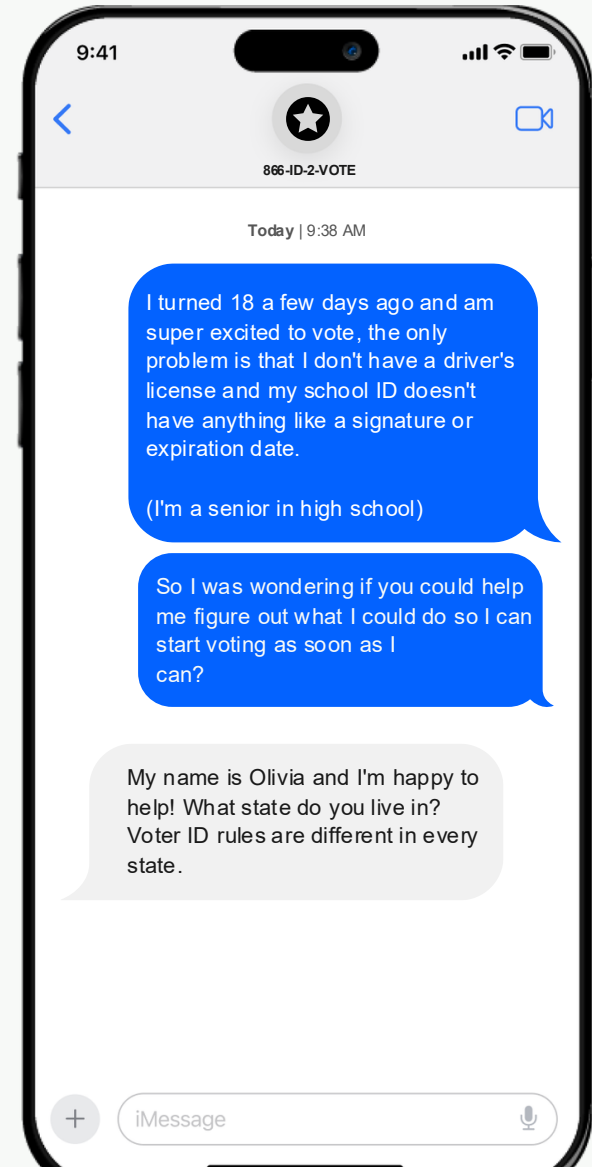
55% of Americans in states where a photo ID is required to vote in person don't know what's required to cast their ballot.¹

Laws magnify inequality

Citizens of color are almost 4x more likely to not have a current government-issued photo ID compared to white citizens¹



The growing number of voter ID laws and frequent changes to regulations creates uncertainty, confusion, and complications in the voting process.

Documentary Proof of Citizenship Laws

Documentary proof of citizenship laws require voters to prove their US citizenship with a document such as a US passport or birth certificate in order to register to vote. DPOC laws also apply to voters who are already registered but who make a change to their registration. For example, if you move, you would need to provide proof of citizenship just to stay registered to vote.

Voter ID Laws

[Voter ID laws](#), on the other hand, become an important factor after voter registration. It is an additional requirement to those required for proving identity and state residency when registering to vote. States with a voter ID law either require or request that voters confirm their identity using a specific form of identification before they cast their ballot.





More than 21.3 million U.S. citizens don't have OR couldn't easily access a passport, birth certificate, or other documentation proving their citizenship.

13% of U.S. Citizens do NOT have ready access to their birth certificates.

150 million U.S. citizens do not have a passport





DISPROPORTIONATE BURDEN ON OTHER VOTERS

- Married women and those who have change names
- Renters and people who move frequently
- Rural residents
- Young voters ages 18-29
- Unhoused and low-income individuals
- Tribal citizens (Tribal ID requires additional documentation)
- People born in U.S. territories- Puerto Rico, Guam, USVI (U.S. citizens at birth)
- Voters who experience natural disasters or housing displacement

IDENTIFIED BARRIERS & COSTS

Barriers include: cost of getting a license, financial or legal difficulties (unpaid fines, reinstatement fees), lack of time, or lack of underlying documents.

Average costs to obtain required documentation:

- Passport = \$165
- Birth certificate = \$50
- Driver's license = \$40
- Round-trip transportation to ID-issuing office = \$35

EVIDENCE FROM STATES WITH DPOC LAWS:

Kansas (2011): DPOC law blocked 31,000 eligible citizens (12% of applicants) from registering.

Documented noncitizen registrations: near zero.

Utah (2025–2026): Audited 2M+ voter registrations. Found 1 confirmed noncitizen registration, 0 noncitizen votes.

HISTORICAL CONTEXT & CURRENT LANDSCAPE

- **Previous DPOC laws:** Arizona (2004) and Kansas (2011)
- State DPOC laws enacted in 2024: New Hampshire and Louisiana
- **2025:** DPOC bills were introduced in 27 states, nearly 4x the number in 2023
→ Only 2 states enacted DPOC laws in 2025
- **2026 carryover:** 37 bills in 23 states would require DPOC or expand voter purges
- Federal SAVE America Act stalls in Senate, redirecting urgency back to state legislatures

State DPOC bills vary on:

- The types of DPOC they accept
- How much discretion do election officials have over what DPOC to accept
- Whether they mandate ongoing voter roll purges

2026 ACTIVE LEGISLATIVE THREATS

FL — H 991 passed House; S 1334 on Senate 2nd Reading
Strips student IDs and public assistance IDs; DPOC + photo ID combined

AZ — SCR 1001 passed Senate; HCR 2001 passed House
Constitutional amendments; bypasses the Governor, goes directly to the voters

GA — SR 838 passed Senate Ethics Committee 3/3; on Senate floor
Constitutional amendment: photo ID + citizenship-only voting

MI — HJR 2 at House Third Reading since April 2025
Constitutional amendment positioned to move quickly if leadership acts

The SAVE America Act: What it Changes, What it Requires, What the Evidence Shows

Passed U.S. House February 11, 2026 | Now awaiting a Senate vote | All Republicans + 1 Democrat

REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS

- **Requires all Americans** to show documentary proof of U.S. citizenship (DPOC) to register or re-register (update) voter registration
- **Applies to all forms of registration:** in person, online, by mail, DMV, public assistance agency, third-party registration
- **No cure period.** DPOC must be provided at the time of registration; it cannot be submitted after the registration deadline
- **Voters already affirm U.S. citizenship under penalty of perjury when registering.** This creates a new documentation layer on top

NEW IN THE SAVE AMERICA ACT (February 2026)

- Requires photo ID every time you vote. **In-person AND by mail**
- Mail voters must submit a **photocopy** of a qualifying photo ID with their ballot
- States must **submit voter rolls to DHS monthly for citizenship verification**, enabling ongoing voter purges
- Criminal and civil liability for election officials who fail to comply

Takes effect **IMMEDIATELY** upon enactment. No phase-in period, no implementation funding provided.

✓ ACCEPTED for Registration (DPOC)

- REAL ID (driver's license or state ID) that indicates U.S. citizenship
- U.S. Passport or Passport Card
- U.S. Military ID plus service record showing U.S. birth
- Photo ID from the federal, state, or tribal government showing U.S. birth
- Photo ID that does NOT show U.S. birth + a citizenship document:
 - Certified U.S. Birth Certificate
 - Naturalization Certificate
 - Adoption Certificate
 - U.S. Certificate of Birth Abroad

⚠ If a voter cannot meet these requirements, state election officials must determine how to ascertain citizenship. This creates inconsistency across jurisdictions.

✓ ACCEPTED for Voting (NEW Photo ID Requirement)

- Valid U.S. Passport
- State driver's license
- State-issued non-driver photo ID
- U.S. Military ID
- Tribal ID

✗ NOT ACCEPTED for Voting (even if your state currently allows it)

- Student / university ID
- Employee ID cards
- Medicare / Medicaid / public assistance cards
- VA-issued veterans ID (non-military)
- Signed affidavit in lieu of ID
- Any expired document

WHAT THE EVIDENCE SHOWS

- Federal law already prohibits noncitizen voting. Noncitizen registration and voting are documented to be extremely rare.
- Utah audited 2M+ voter registrations (April 2025–Jan 2026): found 1 confirmed noncitizen registration, 0 noncitizen votes.
- Kansas DPOC law (2011): blocked 31,000 eligible citizens from registering for every noncitizen prevented.
- Violating election laws already carries severe criminal penalties, deportation, and potential jail time.
- The DHS SAVE database (citizenship verification) is already available to states and is being adopted without a federal mandate.

DOCUMENTED PROJECTED IMPACTS OF THE BILL

- Harder voter registration process for all eligible citizens — not just new voters.
- More eligible voters removed from the rolls due to database mismatches and administrative errors.
- **Immediate implementation** — no phase-in, no funding — risks significant disruption at 2026 midterms.
- Election officials face criminal and civil liability, increasing turnover, and confusion at the polls.
- Mail voters must submit a copy of a photo ID — a new requirement not currently in place in most states.
- Disproportionate impact on communities of color, low-income voters, renters, young voters, and name-change voters.

HOW REGISTRATION WOULD CHANGE

The SAVE America Act would fundamentally change how every American registers to vote:

- DPOC must be submitted at the time of registration. Online registration would effectively end for most voters
- 42 states currently allow online voter registration. This pathway would be eliminated for most registrants
- Applies to all registration types: in person, by mail, at DMV, public assistance agencies, third-party drives
- 3 million Americans registered by mail, email, or fax in the 2022 election cycle. Mail registration would end
- In-person voter registration drives would be eliminated unless conducted at election offices

IMPLEMENTATION CONCERNS

- Effective immediately — no phase-in period for planning, implementation, or training
- No funding mechanism for database upgrades, digital security, or physical spaces
- No training provisions for election officials who must authenticate citizenship documents
- No privacy protections for the sensitive personal data collected
- Private right of action — enables vigilante litigation against election officials for routine errors
- Would turn election offices into public-facing document authentication agencies without additional resources
