**\*\*** The Trump Administration’s FY26 budget request proposes combining the Housing Choice Voucher program, Public Housing, Project-Based Rental Assistance, and the Section 811 and Section 202 programs into the State Rental Assistance Block Grant program

<sup>+</sup> The FY26 budget request provides \$10 million, “available until expended, for noncompetitive grants to recipients that received a Tribal HUD-VASH grant in prior years,” and transfers control of the VASH program from HUD to the Department of Veterans Affairs for the creation of a new “Bridging Rental Assistance for Veteran Empowerment” (BRAVE) program, funded at \$1.1 billion
