## SUMMARY OF DEADLINES (as of January 24, 2018)

# **Transitional Sheltering Assistance (TSA)**

**Texas: March 12**. Participants must complete a mid-term eligibility review on February 20. Participating households will receive a phone call, email, and/or text message advising them if they have continued eligibility for assistance through a TSA participating hotel. The TSA program pays for survivors to stay at hotels while they look for long-term housing.

**Florida: February 10**. Participants will receive a phone call telling them whether they are eligible and what they need to do to remain. Eligible households not currently in the TSA program are automatically notified.

**Puerto Rico: March 20**. Participants must complete a mid-term eligibility review on <u>February</u> <u>13</u>. Participating households will receive a phone call, email, and/or text message advising them if they have continued eligibility for assistance through a TSA participating hotel.

## **Individual Assistance (IA)**

**California, March 16**. Those affected by the wildfires, flooding, mudflows, and debris flows in Southern California can register with FEMA through March 16.

**Puerto Rico, March 20.** Applications for the Individuals and Households (IHP), Other Needs Assistance (ONA), Rental Assistance, and Home Repairs are due March 20.

*Virgin Islands, January 8.* Survivors of both Hurricanes Maria and Irma had until January 8 to register for assistance with FEMA.

# **SBA Low Interest Loans**

Florida, June 11. For SBA loans relating to economic injury.

**Puerto Rico, March 20.** SBA provides low-interest loans to help homeowners repair or rebuild and renters with property damage expenses as well as with moving and storage and transportation expenses. The deadline to apply is March 20.

**California, January 29**. According to <u>SBA</u>, nonprofits have until January 29 to apply for lowinterest loans to repair or replace damaged or destroyed property, and until August 28 to apply for loans to cover for economic injury.

*Virgin Islands, January 8. Renters, homeowners, nonprofits, and businesses in the Virgin Islands, whether impacted by Maria or Irma had until December 8 to apply for low-interest SBA loans.* 

### **Disaster Unemployment Assistance**

Virgin Islands, December 29. The deadline was December 29.

**Puerto Rico, February 9**. Individuals who lost their livelihood because of either Hurricanes Irma or Maria may be eligible for FEMA funded Disaster Unemployment Assistance (DUA). The benefit applies to those who were employees or self-employed.

### **Immediate Foreclosure Relief**

Hurricane Harvey, February 21. HUD has extended the foreclosure moratorium for properties designated for Individual Assistance (IA).

Hurricane Irma, March 9.

Hurricane Maria, March 19.
