## Florida Update

Despite Puerto Rico's legal framework where official titles do not determine ownership, and FEMA's own guidelines, unverified ownership was the most common reason that FEMA denied housing recovery aid to survivors after Hurricane Maria (García, Olshansky, and Carrasquillo 2019), totaling about **77,000 denied households** (Congressional Documents & Publications 2020).

#### 2021 Disasters: Flooding and Tornados

CDBG-DR Plan

#### Context

- → Hearings the week of October 31
- → \$74M allocated for both disasters
- → Additional \$49M according to media reports
- → 4 HUD-designated Most Impacted and Distressed counties
- → State has designated an additional 32 impacted counties

#### What's in the plan?

- → Remaining unmet housing need: \$110M
- → Proposed housing allocation: \$40M
- → Leaving a gap of at least \$70M to address outstanding housing needs

#### HHCK's Observations and Comments

- → Total damaged owner-occupied units: 4757 in the Most Impacted and Distressed areas.
- → Total damaged rental units: 5513 in the MID areas.
- → DLG proposes 30% of the total program allocation to support single family construction and repair and 24% for rental construction and repair, while 54% of the housing damage in the MID areas were rental and 46% were owner-occupied.
- → The proposed single family program allocation is heavily weighted toward home repair (25%) as opposed to 5% for new home construction, when repairs made to experiencing now-recurring flood damage may not be the most effective use of CDBG-DR funds.
- → Similarly, repairing rental units that are mobile homes now experiencing recurrent flooding may not be the most effective use of CDBG-DR funds.
- → DLG should transparently explain its method for determining proposed program allocations that do not match estimated percentages of its own unmet need determination and ensure that housing resources are equitably allocated based on determined needs of homeowners, renters, and people experiencing homelessness.

#### HHCK's Observations and Comments (continued)

- → Plan allows developers including CHDOs to apply directly for new construction funds for single and multifamily.
- → Plan does not appear to allow developers to apply for repair of owner-occupied homes, instead only allowing cities and counties to apply.
- → HUD-assisted property data is limited.
- → Current plan does not incorporate any of the strategies promoted by HUD to address homelessness.
  - TBRA and/or RRH
  - ◆ Emergency shelter infrastructure
  - Permanent supportive housing development

Comment period closed on 11/21.



#### How do FEMA aid amounts compare to max possible amounts?

Thirteen FEMA-Designated Counties vs. Four Hardest Hit Counties (Breathitt, Knott, Letcher, Perry)

#### AHEART: Affordable Housing Emergency Action Recovery Trust Fund

#### 2023: \$150M to AHEART

- → Emergency home repair
- → New home build
- → Multifamily capital repairs
- → Technical assistance to include housing counseling
- → 10% admin to Kentucky Housing Corporation

# AHEART: Affordable Housing Emergency Action Recovery Trust Fund

## 2024: \$150M to AHEART to sustain rebuilding efforts

- → An additional \$150M from the state budget will allow housing providers to fully meet the housing needs exposed since December 2021.
- → Finish repairs and rebuilds with longterm affordability and resiliency
- → Invest in housing counseling to mitigate predatory actors
- → Expedite large redevelopment projects

# Moving Forward



- Currently
  - Version in the House version of the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA)
  - Version in the Senate Transportation, Housing, and Urban Development (THUD) Appropriation Bill
  - End of Year Packages
- Previously
  - Passed the House in 2019
  - Endorsed by HUD and Government Accountability Office in last two Administrations
  - Survey by Bipartisan Policy Center: 97% of CDBG-DR grantees supported permanent authorization
