



# USER GUIDE TO VOTER PLEDGE CARD

Thank you for using *Our Homes, Our Votes* pledge cards to register, educate, and mobilize voters in your community! This guide will walk through the steps of using the pledge card and following up with new voter contacts safely and effectively.

### Remember, you will be collecting personally identifiable information. Be cautious when storing, using, and sharing this information.

- Distribute pledge cards during your voter registration drives and have them on hand during conversations about voting. Be sure to have both <u>English</u> and <u>Spanish</u> pledge cards available.
- 2. Ask the voter to fill out both halves of the pledge card.
- 3. Have scissors or a paper trimmer available, so that you can keep the half of the card with voter's information, and the voter can keep the half with their pledge to vote.
- 4. When collecting and transporting the pledge cards, ensure that they are packed securely so that voters' names and contact information are not visible.

## Be Cautious with Voter Contact Information!



- Be cautious in storing, using, and sharing personally identifiable information
- Only share information digitally when absolutely necessary, in an encrypted file, and with trusted staff/volunteers who will use for its intended purpose
- Store physical pledge cards in a secure location
- Shred physical pledge cards once information is input into an Excel sheet
- Keep Excel sheet on password-protected device

# Distributing and Collecting Pledge Cards



- Distribute and assist voters with pledge cards at voter registration drives
- Available in both English and Spanish
- Have scissors or a paper trimmer on hand so that you can keep half the card for follow-up with voters
- Input voters' responses into a spreadsheet so you can follow up

# **Following Up with Voters**



- Call/text all voters who filled out the pledge card
- Ask them to talk through their voting plan
  - Research shows that articulating a voting plan increases the likelihood of voting when compared to just receiving a reminder
  - Troubleshoot with voters who are having difficulties with their voting plan
- Be sure to provide polling place information to voters who requested assistance with finding it

**Connecting with Voter ID and Transportation Assistance** 

- Option #1: submit information to NLIHC for follow-up
  - We will connect your voters with Rideshare2Vote Aware (for rides to polls) and/or VoteRiders (for voter ID)
  - You should still make follow-up GOTV reminder calls!
- Option #2: submit information directly to Rideshare2Vote Aware and/or VoteRiders
  - Detailed instructions for securely submitting information to each organization can be found in the user guide




