#### About Our Homes, Our Votes



- NLIHC's nonpartisan campaign to boost voter turnout among lowincome renters and people experiencing homelessness, and to elevate housing as an election issue
- Empowers housing providers, advocates, tenant leaders, and direct services organizations to register, educate, and mobilize voters



# Civic Engagement 101: Turning Voters to Renters – Lessons Learned in Engaging Low-Income Communities

- Renters, especially low-income renters, are severely underrepresented in the political process. In the 2024 general election, only 52.1% of eligible renters voted, compared to 70.3% of eligible homeowners. The disparity between low-income and high-income people is even greater: only 46.1% of eligible voters in households making below \$20,000 voted, compared to 78.4% of eligible voters in households making above \$100,000.
- While approximately one-third of Americans rent their homes, researchers estimate that renters constitute somewhere between 2% and 7% of elected officials at the local, state, and federal levels.



#### **VOTER ENGAGEMENT IN 2024**

- To reach low-income renters, partnered with nonprofit affordable housing providers:

  - WinnCo
- Engaged Resident Service Coordinators
- Partnered with mobile outreach service (Shower to Empower) to reach unhoused residents
- Tabled at community events
  - Back to School events
  - Major bus hub for National Voter Registration Day
- Canvassed 1,800 residents living in affordable housing May - November 2024
  - By phone
  - Knocked doors
  - Recruited volunteers from local universities and partner orgs to help canvass









#### **VOTER ENGAGEMENT IN 2024**

  - Canvassed 300 renters in person 3 days before Election Day
  - Reminder calls the day before and on Election Day

  - Key partners: Looking Upwards, Latino Policy Institute, Common Cause, Economic Progress Institute, Providence Streets Coalition









#### REFLECTIONS

- Prep is very important
  - Locations, scripts, materials
- Meeting people where they are
  - Ask questions to learn more
  - Connect to issues
- Nonpartisanship
- Access to voter list is extremely helpful
- Accessibility
- Know your state voter laws
- Partnerships with community-based orgs
- Peer leadership
- Collect feedback

**Voter Registration** 




- Make forms available
  - Tabling
- Canvassing
  - Voter registration events

Voter Education & Candidate Engagement



- Voter ID clinics
- Candidate forums
   + questionnaires
- Nonpartisan voter guides
- Signs & messages about deadlines, polling places, etc.

**Voter Mobilization** 



- Reminder phonebanking or textbanking
- Canvassing
- Transportation
- Post-Election celebration

**Voter Protection** 



- Distribute info about Election Protection Hotline
- Inform voters about provisional ballots

MINI-GRANTS FOR 2026 VOTER ENGAGEMENT

Our Homes, Our Votes has launched its first-ever mini-grant program to increase our field's capacity to engage voters. The mini-grant program will fund nonpartisan activities that empower low-income renters and/or people experiencing homelessness to participate in the democratic process. Funds can be used to support immediate nonpartisan voter mobilization activities for state and local elections in 2026, and/or voter registration and education initiatives for participation in the 2026 midterm elections.


