RUN is a collaboration between the Housing Trust Fund Project, Housing California, nonprofit housing providers, and nonprofit housing advocacy organizations. RUN promotes civic engagement among people historically excluded from decision-making tables to advance sound, equitable policy solutions that address affordable housing, homelessness and economic opportunity. Founded in 2014, RUN now is active in seven regions throughout the state: Bay Area, Island Empire, Los Angeles, Orange County, Sacramento, San Diego, and the San Joaquin Valley.

RAP is a collaboration between the Housing Trust Fund Project and the Washington Low Income Housing Alliance intended to. RAP is a statewide network led by people who have experienced housing

injustice organizing together to build power to change state policy through storytelling, organizing, and civic action. Founded in 2016, RAP has leaders in more than 16 cities and 12 counties across Washington state.
