Ballot Measures in 2022 Midterms

- NLIHC tracked nearly 100 measures
- New resources for affordable housing development, acquisition, and rehabilitation
 - ~\$2 billion in bonds
 - New fees and taxes, or reallocation of existing revenues
- Major victories for tenant protections
 - Voters approved measures to establish or strengthen rent stabilization in every community where they had the opportunity to do so

The Momentum Continues in 2023!



- February 2023: Seattle, WA, passes Initiative 135 social housing program
- February 2023: Vancouver, WA, passes Affordable Housing Bonds
- May 2023: Ketchum, Sun Valley, and Hailey, ID, pass measures to dedicate half of revenues from existing tourism taxes to affordable housing
- June 2023: Portland, ME, fails to repeal existing 5% cap on rent increases

Use mail as a core medium.





MAKING HOUSING AFFORDABLE

Southampton is our home. Our kids grow up here, but many have to leave when they get older. Teachers, first responders, firstforighters and healthcare workers move because they can't find affordable places to live. Vote YES on Prop 3 to protect Southampton for generations to come.

NEIGHBORS SUPPORTING NEIGHBORS

Prop 3 provides us with funding to meet our housing needs by creating a small, 0.5% real estate transfer or buyer's fee, with no tax increase on current residents. All the funds will be used to create affordable housing throughout Southampton by either building new homes or restoring old ones.



MORE HOUSING FOR ESSENTIAL WORKERS

The housing crisis is threatening our community. Teachers, healthcare workers, volunteer firefighters, and EMTs can't afford to live here. Prop 3 will create more housing so essential workers can afford to live here and protect our community.

BUILDING AN AFFORDABLE FUTURE

Prop 3 creates affordable housing with no tax increase on existing residents. It is a 0.5% transfer fee, or buyer's fee, that funds new housing throughout the town. It will make sure the kids who grew up here can afford to stay.





TIPS FOR PARTICIPATING IN A TOWN HALL |

Town Hall Meetings: Asking the Best Question

- · Submit a question in advance
- · Tweet your question before the event. Use the #OurHomesOurVotes hashtag.
- · Sit near the microphone
- · Ask direct questions
- · Consider a question with two parts:
- » A Yes/No aspect in the beginning
- » An opportunity for the candidate to offer additional thoughts
- · Include facts in a question
- Videotape the question and answer, and send it to <u>outreach@nlihc.org</u> to be included in the <u>www.ourhomes-ourvotes.org</u> website cataloguing all candidate comments on affordable housing. Share the video via social media using the #OurHomesOurVotes hashtag.
