

In 2011, 7 out of 10 ELI* veteran households were severely cost burdened, meaning they had to spend more than 50% of their income on housing costs.

But for ELI* veterans who have served after 9/11, nearly 9 in 10 were severely cost burdened.


On any given night in 2012, there were almost 62,000 HOMELESS VETS.


However, 1.5 MILLION veteran households were severely cost burdened in 2011, facing HOUSING INSTABILITY.




