

THERE IS A FUNDAMENTAL MISMATCH BETWEEN THE WAGES PEOPLE EARN AND THE PRICE OF DECENT HOUSING

WAGES NEEDED TO AFFORD RENT ACROSS THE U.S.





\$19.35

An American household must earn at least \$19.35

an hour to afford a modest, two-bedroom apartment without spending more than 30% of income on rent.

This wage varies from state to state.
