
OUT OF REACH 2016 FACTS OVERVIEW

WAGES NEEDED TO AFFORD RENT ACROSS THE U.S.



IN 2016, THE 2-BEDROOM NATIONAL HOUSING WAGE IS

NATIONAL LOW INCOME HOUSING COALITION

\$20.30

An American household must earn at least **\$20.30 an hour** to afford a modest, two-bedroom apartment without spending **more than 30% of income on rent**. This wage varies from state to state.
